
Intro Questions

- What does following Jesus mean for you?


Bible Story - John 1:43 - 51



Notice that this encounter is very different to how Jesus treated the woman at the well. He started off very gentle with her, surprising her with his openness, and slowly confronted her with her spiritual need. In this encounter with Nicodemus Jesus is more forceful and direct. Jesus confronts Nicodemus right up front saying "You must be born again". Nicodemus who spent his life worshipping God according to strict Jewish tradition must have been offended by this strange pronouncement. Nicodemus was a devout and upstanding Pharisee, he was a highly religious man. And what does Jesus say? He uses a different metaphor with Nicodemus, rather than pressing him on his lack of satisfaction (I can give you living water). He's pressing him on his self satisfaction.

- Why do you think Nicodemus wanted to talk to Jesus?
- What do you think Jesus meant by 'being born again'?
- Nicodemus was a very religious man he was a member of the Jewish ruling council, how do you think he felt by Jesus telling him "he must be born again"?
- How would you feel if you were Nicodemus?
- Nicodemus knew God and would have followed many of the rules. What was Jesus asking him to do that was different to this?
- How do we recognise when we're following Jesus or when we're following religion?
- Why would Jesus tell this religious man he has done essentially nothing to earn a place in heaven?
- Do you think there is a religious way to sin?
- Would you say you are 'born again'?
