Bible Bit...





- What happens in this part of the story? This is the climax of the story!!
- What do you think Joseph was feeling and thinking when he saw his brothers?
- Read verse 3, what was the brothers initial reaction. Why do you think this was?
- How do you think Joseph was able to forgive them?
- Read Verse 8 what perspective did Joseph have on the situation?

Discussion

Read 1 John 2:9-10 and Romans 13:9-10

- Do you think God wants us to have good relationships with the people around us?
- Why do you think it is good to forgive people, why does God say to do it?
- Why is it easier often to fall out with someone, than to get on with someone?
- 🧟 Do you see patterns of behaviour in yourself that often come up in your relationships? Can you pre-empt this?
- How can we get a right perspective on a relationship which isn't going well?
- What do we need to do if we fall out with someone?

Read Romans 8:37-39

- How does knowing God's love for you help you with difficult relationships?
- How does knowing Jesus rose from the dead, help you have hope over your difficult relationships?

Spend some time praying for each other about healing relationships. You may want to do a response activity with your young people as its a hard topic.

Paper
